# What Can a Book Do?



What can a book do? Teach, inspire, transform. Books create a world of possibility and prepare us for the rest of our lives. Books spark imaginations, grow vocabularies, knowledge, and curiosity. Dolly Parton, the creator of Imagination

Library, believes that if you can read, you can do anything, dream anything, and be anything. Educators have identified that 90% of brain development occurs within the child's first three years. Early reading enhances a child's academic success rate and confidence in kindergarten and subsequent grades. Reading is the cornerstone to learning and success.

Imagination Library is a worldwide program that benefits children from birth until age five with ageappropriate books sent to their homes each month, free of charge. Children from all ethnic groups and income levels are eligible for the program. Currently, our local Right Steps administers the Imagination Library program for over 4,200 pre-school children enrolled in Tippecanoe County.


Engaging, educational books inspire a love of reading and learning. A committee of experts chooses books with a different theme each year. For example, the first year focuses on visually appealing board books with popular rhymes, songs, and fingerplays. The last year in the program covers science, poetry, and school readiness. # **Million Dollar Matching Opportunity**

Stan and Kay Mithoefer have partnered with The Community Foundation to create an exciting matching opportunity to raise \$2 million for Imagination Library in Tippecanoe County. Since Imagination Library has a continuing need for books every year, creating longterm support for the program through an endowment made sense.

The Mithoefers are passionate about early education and its benefits. Kay spent her career as an educator in West Lafayette classrooms and saw first-hand how early reading experiences positively affected children's performance in school. Stan believes that giving children a head start in reading gives them the best chance of finishing school and becoming contributing members of society. Gifts of \$1,000 or greater are matched on a 1:1 basis and added to an endowment named in the Mithoefer's honor. Gifts of \$10,000 or more qualify for a named endowment, i.e., *Joan and James Smith Endowment for Imagination Library.* Matching funds are available through December 31, 2023, or until \$1 million has been raised (whichever is first).

# **Giving Circles**

There is power in numbers. In a philanthropic sense, the more people who support a cause, the greater the impact. The Community Foundation's two giving circles, 100+ Women Who Care and Men Who Give, were founded on the idea that informed donors can collectively make a real difference by practicing philanthropy together. Meetings are held quarterly at the Lafayette Country Club. Membership entails contributing \$500 upfront per year OR a registration fee of \$100 and \$100 at each of the four meetings. You can join at any time throughout the year but in order to take advantage of the pay-ahead option, your membership fees are due by March 31.

Every member can nominate their favorite 501(c)3 at the meeting. Three nominations are chosen randomly, and the member has an opportunity to make a five-minute presentation to inform the group about the organization's mission and needs. Votes are tallied, and the winning organization receives the collective grant from the giving circle. For instance, 140 members of 100+ Women Who Care provided a \$14,000 grant to Tippecanoe Council on Aging in December. That's powerful philanthropy.

As of year-end in 2021, 100+ Women Who Care raised a total of \$376,000 for 28 agencies since 2015. Men Who Give have donated a total of \$177,600 to 24 agencies since its inception in 2016. The men's group currently has 85 members, with a goal to increase memberships to 100 this year. The women's group has 140 members with a goal to increase memberships to 200 this year. The larger each group grows, the more impact we make in Greater Lafayette.

# **Lasting Generosity**

As a child, Joan Hughes accompanied her mother, Dorothy, as she organized blood donations and polio drives in the Lafayette community. Dorothy's passion for nursing extended far beyond her profession. She and her husband, Robert, committed their time and talents to solve the real-world challenges faced by their neighbors.

Their generosity made a lasting impression on Joan. "You emulate what you are raised with," she said. "I decided when I was young that I would help my community as an adult." Joan has kept her commitment. She worked as a communications specialist at State Farm for 42 years, setting up disaster sites throughout Indiana and the nation. She also volunteered at multiple local non-profits including the United Way and Red Cross.

In 2007, Joan established the Robert and Dorothy Hughes Community Fund Scholarship to continue her parents' legacy of giving. The fund provides annual nursing scholarships to area high school seniors. So far, 24 students have benefitted from Joan's generosity. For Joan, the fund not only honors her family, but it also positively impacts Greater Lafayette by addressing local nursing shortages and launching the careers of young adults. "What makes our community strong," she concluded, "is people helping out and donating their time and money."

Joan has chosen to leave The Foundation in her estate plans in order to grow the Hughes Scholarship and continue to honor her parents. Their legacy will live on in perpetuity and continue to impact students in Tippecanoe County.


