Fifty Years in the Making

Only a worldwide pandemic could postpone The Community Foundation's golden anniversary celebration. But celebrate we did. More than 100 guests enjoyed hors d'oeuvres and camaraderie and witnessed inspiring presentations from nine nonprofit organizations on October 21 at Lafayette's Northend Community Center.

Board Chair Andy Gutwein kicked off the evening by recognizing that The Foundation's half-century success is due to the people who support the organizations we serve. As an example of our theme: Honoring the Past ~ Forging the Future, Linda Bowman shared meaningful moments on her 19-year journey with The Foundation. They included serving on the board, establishing a field-of-interest endowment with her partner Glenn Tompkins which

supports at-risk children, practicing philanthropy alongside her daughter and mother in 100+ Women Who Care, and forging her future as a Legacy Society member.

Guests were divided into groups and experienced interactive art, played bingo & learned the needs of seniors in our community, sorted seeds to preserve native plant species, and discovered strategies to end homelessness.

Other guests watched a video about the importance of early childhood education, walked through bigger-than-life colon and lung inflatables, heard songs from *Frozen 2*, and observed mock scenarios about active parenting and child advocacy. The evening provided a unique experiential learning opportunity to see local nonprofits at work.

CEO and President David Lasater concluded the evening by recapping the successes and strides made over the last 50 years, from the first grant of \$5,100 in 1970 to this year's largest discretionary grant of nearly \$60,000. Today we manage more than 245 funds and trusts with assets over \$80M. In 2020, The Foundation granted almost \$2M to the community. This growth would not be possible without the generosity of passionate donors like you every year.

Moving forward, we are committed to being a force of good for the next 50 years and beyond. "As we strive to increase our impact to forge the future of The Foundation and Greater Lafayette, we believe now is the ideal time to publicly launch our Legacy Society Initiative," said Lasater.
