A Rising Tide

Like the river, our community experiences its own ebbs and flows. At times, the economy is thriving. In other times, growth and change are thwarted by limited resources. At The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette, we play a special part in ensuring continued success in the good times but also a vital role in times of hardship.

We have been a steadfast anchor in our area for more than 50 years. On paper, our pillars include asset development, grantmaking, and community convening. In practice, we:

- **Consult with local philanthropists to find and support their charitable interests.**

The Legacy Society, where individuals can promise their ongoing support for cherished organizations and areas of interest beyond their lifetime, continues to be an area of focus for The Foundation. Bequests have historically been a reliable source of growth for The Foundation’s assets, allowing us to continue supporting critical needs in greater ways each year. Our Legacy Society reached 61 members in 2022.

- **Collaborate with nonprofits about their strategic needs and meet them through grants.**

We continue to be a resource for nonprofits through both grants and training opportunities. We were able to expend \$700,000 to nonprofits through discretionary grants in 2022 and provided many opportunities for leaders to learn and develop their skills.

- **Connect with community leaders to identify and find solutions to issues facing Greater Lafayette.**

Partnering with local leaders in 2022, we worked to identify and develop solutions for issues surrounding a critical childcare shortage in Greater Lafayette. These partnerships are ongoing and allow us to maintain a thumb on the pulse of the issues that face our community now and in the future.

We recognize that none of the work we can do for local nonprofits would be possible without generous gifts from donors who trust us to make good investments and have a solid understanding of our community needs. Every donation, whether now or through a commitment to the Legacy Society, is an investment to improve the quality of life in Greater Lafayette. With every charitable gift, the tide rises a bit higher, Inspiring Greater opportunities.

Look inside to discover how The Foundation, generous donors, and dynamic nonprofit partners created a rising tide in Greater Lafayette in 2022.

Inspiring Greater Possibilities

Our assets totaled \$76.56 million. One hundred twenty-eight nonprofit organizations received grants, and 52 individuals received scholarships totaling \$2.36M. We accepted gifts totaling \$1.92 million from 513 donors. For the second year, we saw a significant increase in newly-established funds: 25 in 2022.

The Douglas W. Eberle Not-For-Profit Board Governance Series remains a staple for local nonprofit education. We hosted over 350 people at both virtual and in-person sessions in 2022. Last year, we held our first nonprofit executive education and coaching series funded by Duke Energy and in cooperation with North Central Health Services (NCHS) and United Way of Greater Lafayette. It complemented the Eberle Series by providing leadership training to newer nonprofit staff members. We are continuing this beneficial program in 2023 and 2024.

Our giving circles saw a record-breaking year as well. 100+ Women Who Care finished with 169 members, and our men's group grew to

over 100 members. We are proud to change its name to 100+ Men Who Give. These two giving groups awarded substantial grants to eight local organizations totaling \$104,200. Greater Lafayette is fortunate to have such generous, community-minded individuals who care about the public good. Meetings are held quarterly, and registration is open to the public.

The Foundation continues to support the Wabash Heartland Innovation Network (WHIN) in its fourth year. The range of work is outlined inside, including continued engagement with local educators like Purdue and Ivy Tech and expanded collaboration with farmers and manufacturers.

This annual report illustrates how we've met the challenges we face as a community, giving us hopeful expectations for the future.

OUR PURPOSE

To inspire, nurture, and practice philanthropy, stewardship, and leadership in the community we serve.

SIMPLICITY

Establishing a fund is easy. Donors meet with Community Foundation representatives to review options and The Community Foundation handles the paperwork and the process.

PERFORMANCE

A permanent entity, The Community Foundation preserves the principal of funds, generally disbursing a portion of the investment earnings.

FLEXIBILITY

Donors may choose among fund options, using various kinds of assets to start a fund. Funds may be designated for a specific purpose or given without restriction on how the money will be used to benefit the community.

TAX BENEFITS

Contributions qualify for maximum deductibility under tax laws.

ACCOUNTABILITY

Annual independent auditing, tax return filing, and a carefully chosen volunteer board ensure that funds are used in the public interest and as donors intend.

Community Spirit

The Foundation fosters community spirit by supporting giving groups and providing learning opportunities for nonprofit boards.

Inspiring Greater **POSSIBILITIES**

GROUP GIVING

100+ Men Who Give

111 men reviewed about a dozen nonprofit organizations, and then contributed a combined \$41,400 bringing the total in grants to \$219,000 since its founding.

Recipients in 2022 were: Isaiah 117 House, Food Finders Food Bank, Community Cancer Network, and LTHC Homeless Services.

100+ Women Who Care

169 women reviewed about a dozen nonprofit organizations, and then contributed a combined \$62,800 bringing the total in grants to \$436,900 since its founding.

Recipients in 2022 were: Isaiah 117 House, WeeSpeak Therapy and Learning, Junior Achievement, and It's My Closet.

Board Governance Series

The 2022 Douglas W. Eberle Not-For-Profit Board Governance Series, funded by NCHS and co-sponsored by The Community Foundation and United Way of Greater Lafayette provided nonprofit board members and executive directors the opportunity to participate in seven educational sessions focusing on board leadership. Partnership with Hedges, a BoardSource certified firm, provided a cohesive and engaging curriculum for participants.

WHIN continues to lead the way in making our region a global epicenter in digital agriculture.

WABASH HEARTLAND INNOVATION NETWORK (WHIN)

WHIN saw some exciting progress in 2022, including:

- The Purdue-WHIN teams continue to be highly engaged with the region's farmers and manufacturers. For example, Purdue held a Digital Ag Showcase in the fall to familiarize farmers with new campus testbeds. The Dauch Center for Management of Manufacturing Enterprises surveyed regional manufacturers for their highest needs and created action plans that can help with employee retention, use of Internet of Things technology, maintenance systems, digitization of records, etc. The Digital Supply Chain Tool that helps manufacturers meet supply chain needs locally has expanded beyond the region to serve the state.
- Ivy Tech Lafayette's new precision agriculture laboratory opened in the Fall of 2022, helping to meet the region's need for a skilled digital agriculture workforce.
- WHIN reached a milestone in the number of farmers and manufacturers who are interested in using WHIN-vetted technology. Seventy growers and 31 manufacturers bring the total to over 100.
- WHIN is demonstrating advanced solutions and a new business model for rural broadband. Next-generation wireless gear has been deployed in 6 locations, with more to come. The model enables service providers to contract with WHIN to offer services to customers.

Regional Cultivation Fund (RCF)

- \$4.1M out of an available \$6M in eLearning projects has been awarded to 21 school corporations serving 42,670 students and teachers for eLearning.
- Every Community Foundation in the region received \$50,000 for local projects of their choice, providing an exceptionally flexible source of funds.
- Following an RFP process, the MatchBOX Co-Working studio was awarded \$798K, with a match from the Indiana Economic Development Corporation of \$150K, for a Rural Entrepreneurship program. The initiative is helping counties in the region strengthen local resources to help small business owners and startups to create or refresh new business plans post-Covid.



Ways to Give

Giving to The Community Foundation is as easy as choosing what avenue is most appropriate for you. Donors may establish a fund by transferring assets to The Foundation now, by planning to make a deferred gift later, or by giving both ways.

TYPES OF GIFTS

Gifts of cash

Donors may contribute any amount to any existing fund by check to The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette. Whether in honor or memory of someone or to meet personal charitable wishes, cash gifts help support many community needs. Donors may also give to an agency endowment to support a specific organization.

Publicly-traded securities

Contributions of securities are attractive to those who have held stocks or bonds for a long time. Donors with appreciated securities can contribute them and avoid significant capital gains taxes.

Life insurance

Donors may name The Community Foundation as owner and beneficiary of a new or existing life insurance policy, receiving a current income tax deduction on premium payments.

IRA distribution rollover

Rolling over required IRA yearly distributions directly into an endowment at The Community Foundation provides a way to make tax-free contributions to chosen charities.

Online giving

Contributions in any amount, charged to donors' credit cards, debit cards, or bank accounts, may be made at inspiringgreater.org.

DEFERRED GIFTS

Bequests

Donors may designate bequests to The Foundation in wills or living trusts, in set amounts, as a percentage of an estate's value, or with residual amounts. These bequests are exempt from estate tax.

Charitable gift annuity

With a charitable gift annuity, donors agree to transfer cash or stock to The Foundation in exchange for lifetime income. Tax benefits and attractive, age-based payout rates are available.

Individual retirement accounts

Designating The Foundation as beneficiary of an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) is an excellent way to make a charitable gift, using an asset that otherwise might be heavily taxed as part of the donor's estate.

Charitable remainder trusts

Charitable remainder trusts allow donors to place cash, securities, real estate, or other assets in a trust, which The Foundation invests. The trust provides income to the donor or a loved one for life; the balance goes to The Foundation for a charity of the donor's choice.

ENDOWMENT FUND TYPES

Endowment funds may be started with a \$5,000 gift. Once discretionary and designated funds reach \$10,000 in gifts, grantmaking begins. Distributions on all other funds begin once the endowment reaches \$25,000, or

scholarships reach \$50,000 in gifts. Donors may establish a fund in their name or those they would like to honor.

Advised endowment funds

Advised endowment funds allow donors to participate in grant recommendations. These funds are a viable, cost-effective, and simplified alternative to establishing a private family foundation.

Designated endowment funds

Donors wishing to support one or more specific charitable organizations in perpetuity may establish a designated endowment fund.

Discretionary / unrestricted endowment funds

Discretionary endowment funds are used to address the most pressing community capital needs and are not designated for a specific agency or interest.

Field-of-interest endowment funds

Donors wishing to support a specific interest, such as arts, education, health, children, or the environment, may establish field-of-interest endowment funds. Based on the donor's interest, The Foundation selects appropriate projects to support.

Scholarship endowment funds

Donors who want to help individuals with education or training expenses may establish a scholarship endowment fund in their name or those they would like to honor.

OTHER GIFTS

Memorials, tributes

Gifts in memory of or to honor others may be given to The Foundation for general community use or may be designated to a specific fund.

LET US DO THE HEAVY LIFTING

When John Rowe came to The Community Foundation in 2007, he was looking for a way that his family could pay tribute to their mother's decades of work with the most vulnerable—the oldest and the youngest.

"If you're just starting out, The Community Foundation is the way to go," said John. "They made it so easy to set up an endowment. The great thing is that they handle all the rules and regulations and do all the paperwork. We just had to discuss where we wanted the funds to go and make contributions. Why would you do this on your own?" His family established a fund that now benefits Bauer Family Resources.

His mother, Betty Rowe, was a tireless social worker. She started her career at age 45 working at the Tippecanoe Council on Aging, rising to become the Senior Center's program director. At age 60, Betty realized her dream of becoming a Peace Corps volunteer, which took her to Thailand. During her two-year assignment, she learned the language, partnered with teachers in 14 childcare centers, and helped begin a library. Betty even helped rural women establish a company to produce artificial silk flowers to help pull them and their families out of poverty.

Returning to West Lafayette, Betty accepted a job at Head Start, where she worked past her eighties. Head Start named a building in her honor, the Betty Rowe Early Care & Education Center. The Betty Rowe Endowment supports Bauer Family Resources to help single, young mothers with children, especially those enrolled in the Head Start program. Betty passed away this year at age 91.

"Because of The Community Foundation's connections with the community, they know what's going on," said John. That's a significant advantage when you live out of town. "On my own, I couldn't have figured it out without their network," he said. "The folks at The Foundation are great to work with. They provide help and assistance along the way and are good stewards of the money. This turned out to be terrific. I'm a big fan."

Stan and Kay Mithoefer have partnered with The Community Foundation to create an exciting matching opportunity to raise \$2 million for Imagination Library in Tippecanoe County. Since Imagination Library has a continuing need for books every year, creating

long-term support for the program through an endowment made sense.

The Mithoefers are passionate about early education and its benefits. Kay spent her career as an educator in West Lafayette classrooms and saw first-hand how early reading experiences positively affected children's performance in school. Stan believes that giving children a head start in reading gives them the best chance of finishing school and becoming contributing members of society.

Gifts of \$1,000 or greater are matched on a 1:1 basis and added to an endowment named in the Mithoefer's honor. Gifts of \$10,000 or more qualify for a named endowment, i.e., Joan and James Smith Endowment for Imagination Library. Matching funds are available through December 31, 2023, or until \$1 million has been raised (whichever is first).

The pandemic created and revealed significant learning losses in school children, especially those who were not strong readers. Those with a good foundation fared considerably better. Imagination Library, with your help, can give pre-school children a head start on reading.

Doing Good Through Grants

Dennis Long, the theatre has been the downtown epicenter for live performing arts ever since. In 2000, the building underwent a major renovation. Today, the venue is

managed by Long Center, a nonprofit organization, and continues to receive upgrades via grants and donations to enhance performer experience and audience enjoyment.

Over the last two years, capital grants totaling nearly \$100,000 from The Community Foundation's grants program upgraded the aging

technology systems. This included new speakers, control boards, microphones, mixing equipment, lighting, and audio systems. The upgrades were energy efficient, too, building on the Long Center's goal to save energy.

"The Community Foundation and its funding partners are at the heart of our theatrical upgrades," said Long Center Executive Director John Hughey. "Capital equipment is an area that requires thousands of dollars for a single purchase. We would not be able to advance without the support of CFGL. Audiences in our community are directly benefiting from their generosity," he said. "With the capital support we receive from The Foundation, we can focus on other areas of our fundraising to support programming expenses and education. The grant cycle is vital to our long-term service to the community."

COMING THE LONG WAY

From its storied beginnings in 1920, the Neoclassical-style Mars Theatre evolved from a vaudeville house to a stage for "new" talking movies before being donated to the City of Lafayette by Irving Long in 1977. Renamed the Long Center for Performing Arts as a memorial to Irving's father,

FINDING SOLUTIONS TO HOMELESSNESS

Homelessness results from several factors: financial difficulties, abusive situations, addiction, physical issues, or mental illness. Lafayette Transitional Housing Center (LTHC) Homeless Services finds solutions to overcome homelessness by providing resources to individuals and families. One resource is through Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) that combines affordable housing and on-site case management for formerly homeless individuals and families with high barriers to traditional housing.

PSH helps guests live more stable and productive lives. LTHC Homeless

Services operates 99 PSH units. The Eighth Street Commons complex has 24 private units for individuals with shared bathrooms, kitchen, and living space. It was built in 1930 and because of its extensive use over the years, their floors and doors needed replacement.

"LTHC was so grateful for the support from The Community Foundation for this 'floors and doors' project at Eighth Street Commons," said Jennifer Layton, President/CEO. "Because of the age of the building, and the fact that they are just so heavily used, the floors were pretty dingy – now they are new and beautiful. The need for the doors was a different matter; however, they were really needed for

the safety of our tenants. Again, the age of the building was a factor, but we needed to make sure our folks in housing were not at risk from people sneaking in."

Inspiring Greater Outcomes

In all, 128 nonprofit organizations received grants, and 52 individuals received scholarships totaling \$2,369,030 in 2022. Many grants were for those one-time capital expenses that nonprofits struggle to fund and desperately need. Soliciting and screening applications, verifying eligibility of recipients, and awarding funds are vital ways The Foundation is leading philanthropy initiatives and enriching lives.

The Foundation likes to help organizations that collaborate with others, promote a thriving community, and respond to the needs of people in the neighborhoods and areas served.

GRANT GUIDELINES

Grants typically fund capital needs. The Foundation is especially interested in providing grants that further these impact areas: arts and humanities, education, environment and animals, health, human services, and public/society benefit.

Depending on the circumstances, The Foundation considers funding startup interim, emergency, operating expenses, and programs. Requests from tax-supported organizations, such as schools, are also considered when tax money cannot be used for the purchase.

Review includes evaluating want versus need, potential impact, other funding sources, and the number of people who will benefit.

The Foundation does not fund endowments, program or capital

acquisitions already completed, ongoing operating expenses, religious institutions, political organizations, or candidates.

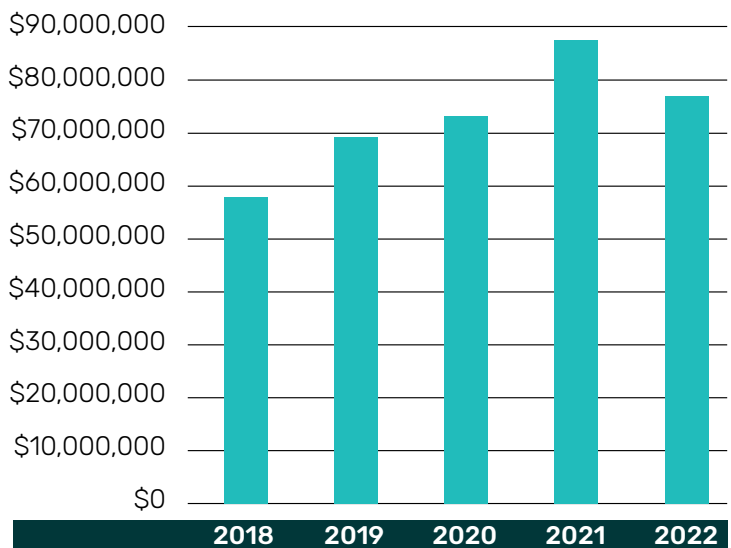

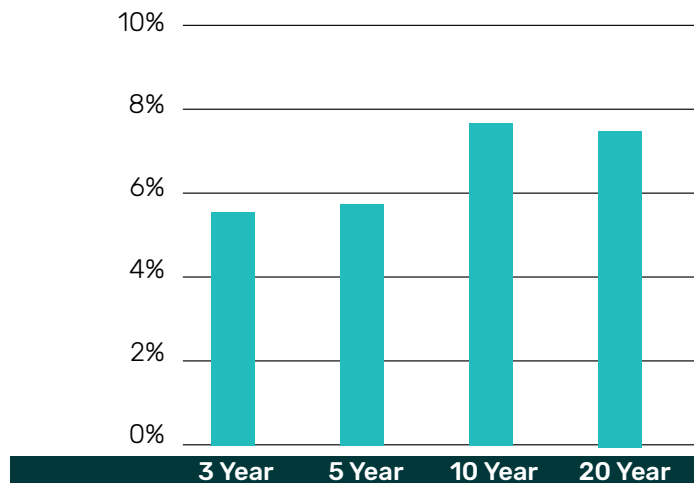


FOUNDATION NET ASSETS

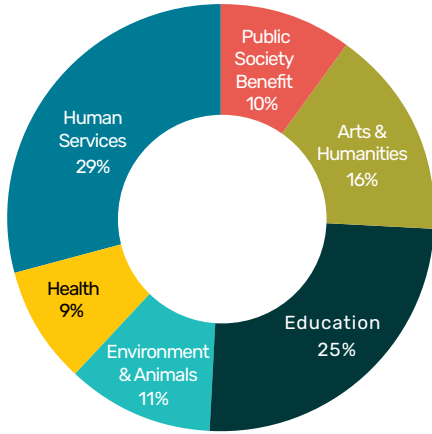

INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE

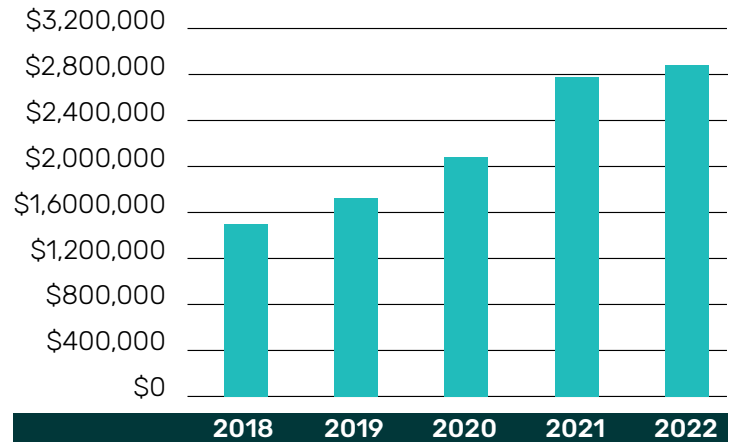


GRANTS BY CATEGORY



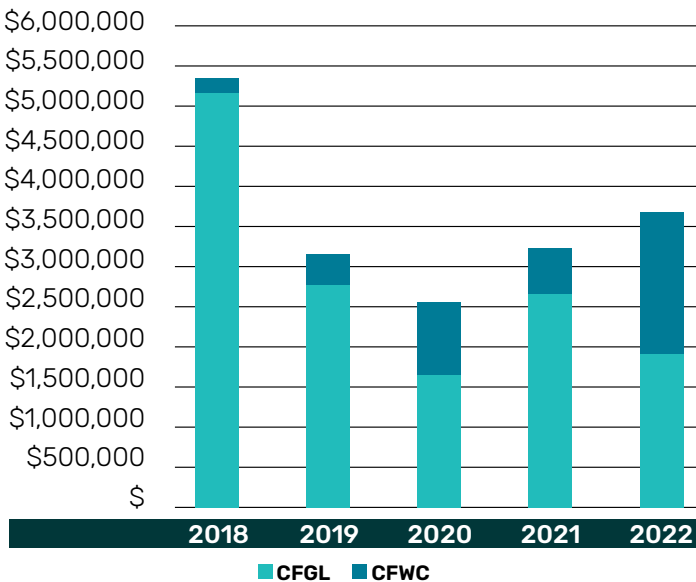
