Endowment Salute to Long Center

"The Long Center's longevity and success are directly linked to the vitality of our funds invested with The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette," said Long Center Executive Director John Hughey at the event held on April 4. "Our goal is to gift the community with concerts and performances, transforming the generosity that we receive into lifelong memories for our guests."

The special salute honored and applauded the Long Center's multifaceted performing arts and its many benefactors. Eighty-five people were in attendance. The stars of the show were two agency endowments: the Long Center Endowment in Honor of Jan André Bootsma and Ken Bootsma and the Long Center Fund. Also honored were two additional designated funds: the Edgar B.

Olson Endowment and Dr. Harry M. Von Tobel Endowment.

"Generations of families have celebrated a night on the town at our beloved 102-year-old theater. From concerts on stage to marriage proposals under the marquee, the endowment salute was an evening to remember those treasured moments," said John. "And it was a night to envision the dancing and soulful celebrations ahead. Most importantly, the endowment salute was an opportunity to thank the hundreds of generous friends



that tirelessly keep the theater's lights shining and the doors open."

Master of ceremonies and Foundation board member Rick Olson said, "Like all of the agency endowment funds managed by The Community Foundation, Long Center receives an annual grant from their funds that may be directed to whatever current needs that they have. An endowment can be a valuable source of support that will help perpetuate an organization's mission far into the future. The Community Foundation is honored and pleased to have the opportunity to partner with the Long Center to ensure its success for years to come."

Long Center is the home of the Mighty Wurlitzer theatre organ, whose repertoire includes an

entire orchestra's musical range, and the Lafayette Symphony Orchestra. Other arts organizations that perform on the stage include Purdue Bands, Purdue Musical Organizations, Purdue Convocations, the Lafayette Ballet, the Passion Play, Wabash Valley Youth Symphony, and many others. WHAT IS A DESIGNATED FUND?

There are many endowment types, but a designated endowment allows for a donor or an agency to set up a fund that will support a specific nonprofit in perpetuity. The funds are invested and the earnings are distributed to the nonprofit annually through a grant. The grant is calculated each year at 4.5% of a three-year trailing average of the fund's market value. Over time, the fund is expected to grow, giving the nonprofit even more security year after year. Pris Gerde is a force of nature. Continually developing, coaching, influencing, strategically planning, and improving the world around her for the greater good is Pris' trademark. Her 37-year corporate career with Eli Lilly and Company was immediately followed by an appointment to serve as an advisor-in-residence with Purdue Daniels School of Business in 2011. Her retirement lasted 23 days.

Her enthusiasm and energy for work overflows into community service. Whether it has been with the Haan Museum of Art, Lafayette Symphony Orchestra, Indiana 4-H, Arthritis Foundation, Prevent Blindness, or her many other interests, Pris pours her heart and hands into each organization. She credits her parents as being inspirational civic-minded citizens who led by example.

Pris has served The Community Foundation in numerous roles. Her first experience began in 2016 as a board member, chairing the Governance and Scholarship Committees. In her two three-year terms as a director, she championed 100+ Women Who Give as one of its early members and took an active role in choosing scholarship recipients. The Pris Gerde Endowment followed to address Greater Lafayette's most pressing needs, and she recently became a Legacy Society member.

"Giving is about trust," she shared. "When you trust an organization, believe in its stability, believe in its leadership, you can trust them with your gifts. It's a leap of faith." That philosophy especially holds true for discretionary endowments. She trusts The Community Foundation to thoughtfully and wisely award grants to nonprofits that need nondesignated funding to accomplish their missions. "You can't have programs if you don't have the infrastructure," said Pris.

Lilly and Beyond

High school students in Indiana with an eye toward college reach for the gold standard in scholarships — the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship. It provides full-tuition and fees as well as a book stipend to any Indiana four-year college or university, public or private. The program is administered locally by community foundations, and statewide by Independent Colleges of Indiana with funding from the Lilly Endowment.

Cody Mullen, a 2007 Lilly Scholar from Tippecanoe County, attained his degrees from Purdue and IU-Indy. He is a Clinical Associate Professor and Purdue's Director of Master of Health Administration Program. Cody joined The Community Foundation's Scholarship Committee in 2015 to give back to The Foundation that helped him pursue his dreams.

"Being a Lilly Scholar was an honor back in high school for the fact that they recognized my activities and a relief knowing that tuition was covered," said Cody. "I am still learning what a gift it was—no debt, no student loans. It gave me greater flexibility in my career." Giving back to the community had always been part of the plan. He enjoys being on the Scholarship Committee to interview potential candidates. "I love being a little part of the magic for these well-deserving students."
