As we reflect on the past year, we are immensely grateful for the support and dedication of our donors, partners, and the entire Greater Lafayette community.

In 2023, we experienced a surge of enthusiasm and generosity from our donors, culminating in the acceptance of two groundbreaking gifts, from Jim and Mary Jo Risk and Betty and Dick Nelson, that have not only expanded our capacity but also left an indelible mark on our organization. These transformative contributions were so significant that we have chosen to honor them by naming key staff positions after the visionary individuals behind them. This serves as a testament to the lasting impact that philanthropy can have on our mission.

We are proud to introduce these named positions: the James Kirby Risk President and CEO and the Betty M. Nelson Director of Philanthropy. "As a founding member of The Foundation and a past board member and board chair, Jim Risk has been an ardent supporter of our work since the literal beginning. He has served as an advisor for every Foundation leader since 1970. Over the years, the Risk family name has become synonymous with community, collaboration, leadership, and success in the business and nonprofit community. I am deeply humbled and honored to serve as the inaugural James Kirby Risk President and CEO," said David Lasater.

Similarly, Betty M. Nelson has served on The Foundation's board and various committees over the years and has a true understanding of our mission and a vision for supporting that mission in perpetuity. David Lasater said, "She is known throughout our community not only for her keystone work as Dean of Students at Purdue University where she championed student rights, but also due to her efforts for all those in need across Greater Lafayette. Betty Nelson is always the first to arrive and the last to leave, she is tireless in her care and concern for others. She has been a trailblazer and advocate, especially for women and she inspires others by always standing up for what she believes in. She has played a vital role in the evolution of The Foundation and her influence will forever be remembered through the Betty M. Nelson Director of Philanthropy, a position inaugurally held by Candy Silver."

Due to the support of these generous donors, The Foundation was able to decrease our administrative fee from 1.5% to 1.25% beginning in 2024. This change will benefit all funds held at The Foundation, providing even more support to deserving nonprofit organizations in our community.

The innovative spirit that propelled us forward in 2023 will become the force for Inspiring Greater good moving forward. We are committed to embracing and fostering innovation as a means of amplifying our impact on the community we serve. By pushing the boundaries of conventional philanthropy, we aim to address complex challenges with creative solutions and make a lasting difference in the lives of those who need it most.

A look at 2023

The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette achieved significant milestones in 2023. We are proud to highlight those achievements in this annual report.

Successes from 2023 include: Our assets totaled \$89.9M. In all, 125 nonprofit organizations received grants and 58 individuals received scholarships totaling \$2.6M. We accepted gifts totaling \$4.97M from 396 donors. For the third year in a row, we saw a significant increase in new endowments established with 43 in 2023 – the most established in a year in our history.

The success of 2023 was due in large part to the launch of the GIFT VIII initiative set forth by Lilly Endowment, Inc. Our community received \$3M in an exciting two-for-one dollar matching to boost gifts to unrestricted/discretionary endowments. GIFT VIII aims to support Indiana community foundations in their efforts to: grow their financial resources to promote long-term viability and sustainability, further strengthen their leadership capabilities, and develop and implement strategic programs, projects and initiatives that enhance their communities' quality of life.

The Douglas W. Eberle Not-For-Profit Board Governance Series continues to be a staple for local nonprofit education. We hosted over 350 people at both virtual and in-person sessions in 2023. We also supported a cohort of 6 individuals through Nonprofit Executive Coaching with certified coaches to grow and learn their leadership skills.

Our giving circles saw a record-breaking year as well. 100+ Women Who Care finished with 165 members and our men's group, 100 + Men Who Give, grew to 110 members. These two giving groups awarded grants to eight local organizations totaling \$106,900. Since its inception in 2015, the 100+ Women Who Care have provided over \$500,000 in grants and both groups combined have awarded \$762,800. Greater Lafayette is fortunate to have generous community-minded individuals who care about the greater good.

The Foundation continues to support the Wabash Heartland Innovation Network (WHIN) in its fifth year. A full update on WHIN's 2023 efforts are included within this report.

As we embark on another year of possibilities, we express our deepest gratitude to all of you who have contributed to the success of The Foundation. Together, we have made strides towards creating more opportunities, possibilities, and legacies.



We Are on a Mission

Every facet of our work is guided by well-planned and well-executed principles and practices.

Our Purpose

To inspire, nurture, and practice philanthropy, stewardship, and leadership in the community we serve.

Simplicity

Establishing a fund is easy. Donors meet with Community Foundation representatives to review options and The Community Foundation handles the paperwork and the process.

Performance

A permanent entity, The Community Foundation preserves the principal of funds, generally disbursing a portion of the investment earnings.

Flexibility

Donors may choose among fund options, using various kinds of assets to start a fund. Funds may be designated for a specific purpose or given without restriction on how the money will be used to benefit the community.

Tax Benefits

Contributions qualify for maximum deductibility under tax laws.

Accountability

Annual independent auditing, tax return filing, and a carefully chosen volunteer board ensure that funds are used in the public interest and as donors intend.

GROUP GIVING

Two philanthropic groups learn about and support local nonprofits at quarterly meetings.

100+ Men Who Give

110 men reviewed about a dozen nonprofit organizations, and then contributed a combined \$43,000 bringing the total in Grants to \$262,000 since its founding. Recipients in 2023 were: Heartford House, PALS, Community Ventures in Living, and Quilts for Kids.

100+ Women Who Care

165 women reviewed a dozen nonprofit organizations, and then contributed \$63,900 bringing the total in Grants to \$500,800 since its founding. Recipients in 2023 were: Lafayette Urban Ministry – Immigration Clinic, Group Homes for Children, Transformed Birth Services, and Community Cancer Network.

NONPROFIT EXECUTIVE COACHING

In 2023, we supported the second cohort of 6 local nonprofit executives to receive one-on-one and peer-to-peer coaching. This opportunity was established in 2022 with the partnership of Duke Energy, North Central Health Services, United Way of Greater Lafayette, and The Foundation to support local executives' desire to improve their skills related to leadership, time management, team-building, and decision-making.

BOARD GOVERNANCE SERIES

The 2023 Douglas W. Eberle Not-for-Profit Board Governance Series, funded by NCHS and co-sponsored by The Community Foundation and United Way of Greater Lafayette provided nonprofit board members and executive directors the opportunity to participate in seven educational sessions focusing on board leadership. Partnership with Hedges, a BoardSource certified firm, provided a cohesive and engaging curriculum for participants. A key feature of the 2023 series was inclusion of a hands-on workshop portion of each session, which allowed participants to apply topics learned in the session in actionable ways.

WHIN Celebrated the Successful Completion of their \$10M Regional Cultivation Fund in December.

WABASH HEARTLAND INNOVATION NETWORK (WHIN)

WHIN's accomplishments during 2023 included:

- Receiving a \$1M grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce/EDA to scale up WHIN's Innovation as a Service program. The grant will allow WHIN to complete 40 projects with 20 manufacturers over the next 3 years, helping more plants begin the transition to Manufacturing 4.0.
- Helping one of WHIN's first ag tech partners, Solinftec, complete pilots of its revolutionary autonomous precision spraying solution and identify manufacturers in the region to begin production. Still Waters Manufacturing in Montgomery County is now the first robotics plant dedicated to agriculture to begin production in the Midwest, and Kirby Risk is fabricating the electrical harnesses. Solinftec moved its U.S. headquarters from Brazil, S.A., to West Lafayette in 2019.

- Contracting with service providers to begin serving customers on WHIN's neutral host broadband network.
- Launching WHIN Consortium, which connects technology vetting and pilots in WHIN's Living Lab with other large corporations interested in ag tech.
- Completing awards of WHIN's Regional Cultivation Fund, including \$6M to 28 regional school corporations to support online learning platforms to K-12 students, from 1:1 devices, new campus networks, school bus hotspots and interactive classroom whiteboards to virtual laboratory curriculum. The program included \$1M from NCHS.
- Launching "Will You Yield?," an interactive module developed with SkyePack that uses WHIN Living Lab resources to introduce high school agriculture students to digital technology. The module uses a unique game model on a hybrid classroom/virtual platform.
- Becoming the Microsoft TechSpark partner for Indiana.

Many Ways to Give

Giving to The Community Foundation is as easy as choosing what avenue is most appropriate for you. Donors may establish a fund by transferring assets to The Foundation now, by planning to make a deferred gift later, or by giving both ways.

TYPES OF GIFTS

Gifts of Cash

Donors may contribute any amount to any existing fund by check to The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette. Whether in honor or memory of someone or to meet personal charitable wishes, cash gifts help support many community needs. Donors may also give to an agency endowment to support a specific organization.

Publicly Traded Securities

Contributions of securities are attractive to those who have held stocks or bonds for a long time. Donors with appreciated securities can contribute them and avoid significant capital gains taxes.

Life Insurance

Donors may name The Community Foundation as owner and beneficiary of a new or existing life insurance policy, receiving a current income tax deduction on premium payments.

IRA Distribution Rollover

Rolling over required IRA yearly distributions directly into an endowment at The Community Foundation provides a way to make tax-free contributions to chosen charities.

Online Giving

Contributions in any amount, charged to donors' credit cards, debit cards, or bank accounts, may be made at www.inspiringgreater.org.

DEFERRED GIFTS

Bequests

Donors may designate bequests to The Foundation in wills or living trusts, in set amounts, as a percentage of an estate's value, or with residual amounts. These bequests are exempt from estate tax.

Charitable Gift Annuity

With a charitable gift annuity, donors agree to transfer cash or stock to The Foundation in exchange for lifetime income. Tax benefits and attractive, age-based payout rates are available.

Individual Retirement Accounts

Designating The Foundation as beneficiary of an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) is an excellent way to make a charitable gift, using an asset that otherwise might be heavily taxed as part of the donor's estate.

Charitable Remainder Trusts

Charitable remainder trusts allow donors to place cash, securities, real estate, or other assets in a trust, which The Foundation invests. The trust provides income to the donor or a loved one for life; the balance goes to The Foundation for a charity of the donor's choice.

ENDOWMENT FUND TYPES

Endowment funds may be started with a \$5,000 gift. Once discretionary and designated funds reach \$10,000 in gifts, grantmaking begins. Distributions on all other funds begin once the endowment reaches \$25,000, or a scholarship reaches \$50,000, in gifts. Donors may establish a fund in their name or those they would like to honor.

Advised Endowment Funds

Advised endowment funds allow donors to participate in grant recommendations. These funds are a viable, cost-effective, and simplified alternative to establishing a private family foundation.

Designated Endowment Funds

Donors wishing to support one or more specific charitable organizations in perpetuity may establish a designated endowment fund.

Discretionary / Unrestricted Endowment Funds

Discretionary endowment funds are used to address the most pressing community capital needs and are not designated for a specific agency or interest.

Field-of-Interest Endowment Funds

Donors wishing to support a specific interest, such as arts, education, health, children, or the environment, may establish field-of-interest endowment funds. Based on the donor's interest, The Foundation selects appropriate projects to support.

Scholarship Endowment Funds

Donors who want to help individuals with education or training expenses may establish a scholarship endowment fund in their name or those they would like to honor.

OTHER GIFTS

Memorials, Tributes

Gifts in memory of or to honor others may be given to The Foundation for general community use or may be designated to a specific fund.

Foundation Stewardship



The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette administers more than 344 funds (plus four held for other community foundations), ranging in size from \$5,000 to over \$3 million. The Foundation serves as steward to those funds listed here in addition to all of the scholarships and funds on the Legacy Society page.

GOLDEN RULE ECONOMICS

Shaped by the circumstances of their childhoods and recent hands-on eldercare, Randy and Kathy Vernon have a firm grasp of the community's most vulnerable populations.

Several years ago, they established a field-of-interest endowment at The Community Foundation to address the need: Randy and Kathy Vernon Endowment for At-Risk Youth. The endowment helps fund organizations that help disadvantaged youth realize their full potential as responsible, productive, and caring citizens.

After Kathy's mother fell ill, the Vernons wanted to do something for a nonprofit organization that aids the elderly, especially those in most need. They established a new designated endowment: Randy and Kathy Vernon Endowment for Tippecanoe County Council on Aging. They also chose to create a discretionary fund through Lilly Endowment, Inc.'s Phase VIII gift matching campaign in 2023.

Becoming Legacy Society members was another step in their estate planning. "What appealed to us is that we can do something good that lasts into perpetuity," said Kathy. "Planning our legacy through The Community Foundation was easy and flexible. We could even include future gifts to our church through them."

KEEPING IT NATURAL

Loving the outdoors – its land and creatures – was a common bond for Susan Howell Ulrich and her late husband, Dolph (Ted). The Ulriches' mutual love of birding inspired Susan to serve on the board of the Sycamore Audubon Society. She started the Sycamore Audubon Society Endowment with The Community Foundation in January 2021 to support Audubon's mission and programs.

In addition, Susan is involved with NICHES (Northern Indiana Citizens Helping Ecosystems Survive). Susan and other board members created the NICHES Endowment Foundation to provide permanent funding for land protection. During a Lilly match, the board established a separate endowment with The Community Foundation.

When Ted passed away in 2020, Sausan began to explore how to honor him and the interests they both loved. Becoming a Legacy Society member made sense. "The Community Foundation simplified my life in many ways," remarked Susan. She met with Director of Philanthropy Candy Silver, and together, they mapped out a plan to carry out philanthropic wishes that will last a lifetime and beyond.

Doing Good through Grants

CLEARING THE WAY

The Wabash River Enhancement Corporation (WREC) was established as a nonprofit in 2004 with a mission to improve the land and quality of life along the Wabash River Corridor for local residents and wildlife. They work closely with the Cities of Lafayette, West Lafayette, and Tippecanoe County to work toward this mission. In 2022, WREC applied for and received a NOW grant from The Foundation to purchase equipment and herbicide to aid in their efforts to turn a plot of land in downtown Lafayette into a public green space. The space was unfortunately overrun with invasive species that threatened the health of native plants, lowered biodiversity, increased erosion, and inhibited their efforts to develop an area useful to the public.

In January 2023, WREC hosted a public work day with the City of Lafayette to begin working to clear the invasive honeysuckle. Along with 10 community volunteers, including Purdue students, they cleared and hauled away 20 truckloads of honeysuckle. While their work to improve the area is ongoing, the grant from The Foundation has given them a jumpstart on this important project. Amy Krzton-Presson, WREC Watershed Coordinator says, "We've been chipping away at invasive shrubs with manual tools for a while. This grant from the Community Foundation allowed us to purchase electric chainsaws and backpack sprayers. We'll be much more effective and impactful at improving riverfront ecosystems now that we have the right tools!"

TO LEARN IS TO GROW

Junior Achievement of Greater Lafayette aims to prepare the younger generation for success within a global economy. Their approach involves delivering free educational programming to local schools, ensuring that a wide range of students can benefit from their initiatives. They take the old adage, "to learn is to grow," to the next level by immersing students in the learning process.

In the spring of 2023, Junior Achievement received an instrumental \$10,000 grant they used to acquire iPads to integrate into their core financial planning and career exploration programs. One program, JA Biztown, immerses children in a hands-on experience where they navigate a simulated "real-world" environment. Students gain practical insights into the responsibilities of adulthood they hold jobs, participate in civic duties like voting, and buy and sell products. The other program, JA Finance Park, focuses on helping children discover their potential across various careers. Students explore different vocations, fostering a clearer understanding of the professional landscape.

"Because of The Foundation's grant, we can now serve up to 150 students in our facility. We are truly making a difference in our community as we link arms and prepare students to succeed in our global economy through programming that focuses on financial literacy, work readiness and the importance of entrepreneurship," said Junior Achievement Executive Director Jen Edwards.

Grants Awarded

In all, 125 nonprofit organizations received grants, and 58 individuals received scholarships totaling \$2,621,802 in 2023. Many grants were for those one-time capital expenses that nonprofits struggle to fund and desperately need. Soliciting and screening applications, verifying eligibility of recipients, and awarding funds are vital ways. The Foundation is leading philanthropy initiatives and enriching lives.





How to Apply for a Grant



Because of the generosity of many donors, The Community Foundation of Greater Lafayette invests in Tippecanoe County nonprofit organizations that are taxexempt under section 501 (c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Service Code and who have a clear mission, effective operations, proven success, strong staff and board leadership, responsible accounting and fiscal management, and sustainability.

The Foundation likes to help organizations that collaborate with others, promote a thriving community, and respond to the needs of people in the neighborhoods and areas served.

GRANT GUIDELINES

Grants typically fund capital needs. The Foundation is especially interested in providing grants that further these impact areas: arts and humanities, education, environment and animals, health, human services, and public/society benefit.

Depending on the circumstances, The Foundation considers funding startup interim, emergency, operating expenses, and programs. Requests from tax-supported organizations, such as schools, are also considered when tax money cannot be used for the purchase.

Review includes evaluating want versus need, potential impact, other funding sources, and the number of people who will benefit.






INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE






GRANTS BY CATEGORY


