A Proper Resting Place

Until a grant provided by The Foundation in the spring of 2024, those who passed away in Fairfield Township with no known relatives were graciously cared for by Fisher Funeral Home with the assistance of the County Coroner. However, a plan is necessary due to space limitations and the desire to provide a meaningful permanent burial site for these individuals.

With the grant, Fairfield Township will be able to renovate an 1800's Receiving Vault at the Greenbush Cemetery to be the final resting place of these community members.

Township Trustee, Monica Cassanova said of the project, "Our Greenbush Cemetery is a nationally recognized historic cemetery. Many of the city's founders are buried there, including William Digby. However, there are unclaimed members of our community who have passed away and are not remembered or recognized. With grant funds from The Community Foundation, we will be able to provide dignity to unclaimed cremains the Township has taken financial responsibility for.

We will repurpose the Cemetery's cold storage to build a columbarium to inter the unclaimed cremains and provide a dedicated space to memorialize the unclaimed cremains of the most dispossessed in our community."
