Optimistic About the Future

Steve and Cherie Bruhn were practically beaming while they spoke about their involvement with the Greater Lafayette community. Steve, a retired CPA, and Cherie, a retired registered nurse, are very invested in civic organizations that focus on youth. Through the Lafayette Breakfast Optimist Club, they've helped organize the Annual Fat Tuesday Dinner, which raises money for local teacher grants. The Bruhns also participate in Christmas poinsettia sales to provide financial and hands-on support for a variety of youth

organizations ranging from Junior Achievement to Big Brothers Big Sisters. The outreach is impressive for a breakfast club. Steve and Cherie have been involved for 21 years and they support the Lafayette Optimist Foundation.

Together, he and Cherie are committed to reading literacy. Giving children an early foundation in reading helps them become more successful in school and in life. They established the Steve and Cherie Bruhn Endowment for Imagination Library through The Community Foundation in 2023 to provide all children (ages 0-5) with the opportunity to love learning through books. Dolly Parton's Imagination Library program is available in Lafayette through Right Steps, as well as throughout the USA and other countries. If available in their area, parents can sign up

their children to receive one free book per month until age five, for a total of 60 books.

The Bruhns have been married for almost 25 years. Cherie's two children, David and Heather, and three grandchildren, Lily, Ruby, and Liam, add joy to the Bruhn family. Pictures of happy children adorn the walls of their home. But into every life a little rain must fall. Steve was diagnosed with

cancer in 2020, amidst the onset of the coronavirus outbreak. In the years hence, he underwent radiation, chemotherapy, surgery, and infusions to combat the disease. Having 10 to 11 doctor appointments per week, they realized how difficult it must be for those without transportation or family help. Not to mention the financial hardships that may occur when a person is undergoing treatment. The Bruhns became supporters of the Community Cancer Network, whose mission is to support the non-medical needs of area cancer patients. They recently started an endowment through The Community Foundation to help the organization's outreach to its 12-county area.

Steve and Cherie continue to be optimistic about their future and exhibit their positivity by investing in the community they've come to love.

A Brush with Kindness

Things happen. As most homeowners soon discover, purchasing a house is just the first step in securing a safe and decent place to live. Appliances break, faucets leak, gutters clog, or the house requires accessibility upgrades. For those on fixed incomes, including the elderly and disabled, making repairs or upgrades presents a significant challenge. That's why the Brush with Kindness program exists.

As an arm of Habitat for Humanity, A Brush with Kindness has its first dedicated program director, Jeremy Vegter, whose entire attention is focused on addressing the community's need for minor home repairs and renovation projects. Labor, usually a prohibitive expense, is provided free of charge by volunteers. Since the program's inception in 1984, over 1,400 people in Greater Lafayette have received critical repairs to make their homes safer, more secure, and more accessible. this year, 180 people have benefitted from the program, with many more on the waiting list.

Additional criteria, besides the financial guidelines, stipulate that recipients must own their homes, not rent, and pay for the project materials (or make payments to the program). For extensive renovations, like roof or window replacements, A Brush with Kindness refers homeowners to trusted local contractors. A new program, CARE (Community Assistance for Repairs

and Equity), enables residents to apply for a grant of up to \$15,000 for select home renovations. Applications for CARE and A Brush with Kindness can be submitted online at lafayettehabitat.org/bwkapp or called in at (765) 423-4590, extension 112.

Memorable jobs include helping Debra and Mel, both wheelchair-bound, to retain their home insurance by fixing their gutters and assembling a storage shed for their belongings. Janie, who has Parkinson's, had a walkin tub installed so she could safely age in place. Popular projects include fixing up bathrooms, entryways, or doing yard work. But all repair jobs are considered. Most volunteers possess specific "handyman" skills, but others, such as student groups, spruce up, mulch, or paint where needed. Jeremy's goal is to increase the number of volunteers who are the lifeblood of the program's success.

The Community Foundation awarded the program a \$30,000 grant to purchase a truck for hauling ladders, mulch, and building materials to job sites. The 2025 Toyota Tacoma Extended Cab truck displays Habitat's

Max for the Minimum

'Tis the season to make sound financial decisions. If you own an Individual Retirement Account and are age 70½, you may donate up to \$100,000 directly to a charity tax-free from the account. If you are 73 or older, you must take a required minimum distribution (RMD) from your traditional IRA each year by Dec. 31. RMDs are considered taxable income at your current tax bracket. However, if you don't need the income, please consider maximizing your minimum distribution through a charitable donation to The Community Foundation, thus avoiding tax consequences and creating a world of good. For those who no longer itemize deductions, this is a great tax break.
